Cell Phone Policy

Per the Family Handbook:

The use of cell/smart phones, and smart watches during the school day is prohibited. The reason for such a prohibition is to promote an

uninterrupted academic environment. The Academy has a compelling interest in keeping students not just physically present on campus, but mentally and emotionally present as well, and the ways in which use of phones and social media encourage detachment from real persons and conversations are a commonplace.

While the ubiquity of personal technology is a given, the following restrictions/allowances apply at the school: I.A student should keep a cell phone turned off (not merely

silenced, but off) and cell phones and smartwatches must be stored in their locker during the school day. Cell phones may not be brought in pockets or purses into classrooms.

2.Cell phone use is permitted on campus after school and only in the school office area or outside the building.

3.If a student needs to phone a parent/guardian during the school day, the student must come to the school office to use one of the school's phones. In rare cases in which parents/guardians need to get an emergency message to a student before the end of the school day, they should call the school's main telephone line and ask for a message to be delivered. Parents/guardians should be mindful that texts or other messages that they send directly to the student during the school day are to be picked up only after school dismissal.

4. Violation of the above restrictions will result in confiscation of the cell phone and disciplinary action. Cell phones will be turned in to the school office and released only to parents/guardians after confiscation.

A Week-end Enrichment Activity

for the GreatHearts North Phoenix Prep Community

Master Michael Kaneen and 9 Dragons Kung Fu is pleased to present a practical course in self-defense for North Phoenix Prep female students. This course focuses on the key aspects of self-defense for women, including knowledge, instinct, preparation, situational awareness, and specific techniques for repelling a physical attack.

The program will be conducted by a corps of certified instructors at the facilities of 5 Elements Kung Fu in three, two-hour classes. Sessions will be held on Saturday afternoons in April: the 1st, 8th and 15th. There will be one make-up session in April (the 22nd) for participants who have missed a class. The program is open to all female Prep students (grades 7 to 12) as well as moms and dads and teachers and staff of North Phoenix Prep. Registration is limited to 40 participants on a first-come, first-served basis. Payment is required in advance, and liability waivers must be completed for each participant prior to taking part in the lessons. Registration fees are not refundable.

Absences

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31st Street Storm Drain, Pavement, and Pedestrian Improvements: Thunderbird Road to Hearn Road

Construction Notice

February 2023

The City of Phoenix Street Transportation Department has contracted with Hunter Contracting Co. to construct sidewalk and driveway improvements, new storm drain pipe and associated catch basins, relocate an existing water line and install a new portion of water line and pavement replacement in 31st Street from Thunderbird Road to Hearn Road.

What to Expect:

- Construction will begin Tuesday, March 7, 2023.
- Contractor's work hours will generally be Monday -Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (winter hours) and 6:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (summer hours). Some night work may be required.
- ROAD CLOSURE: 31st Street will be closed from Thunderbird Road to south of Hearn Road for approximately 6 months. Local access will be maintained for access to Friess Road and the Century Link parking lot.
- Pedestrian access will be maintained with a 36-inch accessible path on all pedestrian walkways.
- Beginning in mid-May 2023, Village Square Apartments north side parking lot access and parking will be restricted in phases during the storm drain pipe and catch basin installation. Apartment management and residents will be notified prior to any restrictions.
- Water service interruptions will occur; however, residents and business will be notified prior to any scheduled water service interruptions.
- Anticipated project completion is December 31, 2023.
