AM Dropoff and PM Pickup

Thank you to our Gladiator community for exercising patience as we kicked off the school year with 200 additional students on campus and adjusted bell schedules at ANP and NPX. We realize that the drive-line can be daunting, but we are confident in our system and know that the mornings and afternoons will be much smoother once everyone gets into a rhythm. Here are a few rules and pointers:

- *Keep in mind that Archway dismisses 30 minutes before NPX on regular days. Thus, entering the line prior to 3:30 will likely slow down Archway's dismissal if a Prep parent is in the line before them. On Wednesday, NPX dismisses before ANP so you are encouraged to be in line by 1:15pm.
- *All Prep parents must stay in the outside drive lane until they pass the field. Please do not block the turn lane which may prevent an Archway parent from moving towards their pickup line.
- *PM Pickup ONLY Once you have passed the field/Hearn entrance, you may split into 2 different lines for pickup. Once your child(ren) are in the vehicle, please enter the center lane and exit campus. Children may not enter a vehicle that is in the center lane. Please pull to either side for pickup.
- *ANP/NPX Siblings may only exit campus through our academic building. Exiting on the Archway side or through side gates is not permitted.
- *Hearn Road is not monitored by ANP/NPX staff. Crossing in the middle of the road is highly discouraged as it is a significant safety issue.
- *Parking/Stopping along Hearn to dropoff/pickup your scholar is in violation of city ordinance. Please understand that you may be ticketed should Phoenix PD witness this.

From the Deans' Office

On Monday teachers will begin issuing Nota's for dress code infractions. Here are few reminders for infractions that have been noticed this week.

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Shoes

Boys' Footwear/Socks: Boys may wear all black low-top athletic shoes or black leather or simulated leather dress shoes in lace-up or loafer style. As a reminder, dress shoes require periodic hand cleaning and polishing/conditioning. Plastic shoes are not uniform attire. Socks must be all black in color, extend at least two inches above the ankle at crew length and be free of visible brand logos, patterns or decorations. Students with medical foot problems requiring special footwear should consult the "Medically-Necessary Footwear" document

Girls' Footwear/Socks: Girls may wear all black low top athletic shoes or black leather or simulated leather dress shoes with a 1.5 inch or less heel (measured at back of heel) and low sole. As a reminder, dress shoes require periodic hand cleaning and occasional polishing/conditioning. Plastic or sequined shoes are not uniform attire. Socks must be solid black in color, extend at least two inches above the ankle at crew length up to below the knee and be free of visible brand logos. Nylons or tights must either be knee length or extend from the foot to the waist. All socks, nylons and tights must be solid black in color and free of logos, patterns or decorations. Students with medical foot problems requiring special footwear should consult the "Medically-Necessary Footwear" document.

Skirts

Girls may wear the official uniform skirt. Skirts must be worn at the waist with the waistband visible at all times. When properly adjusted at the student's waist, the skirt hem should be touching the top of the knee. Skirts may be longer if desired. The Academy recommends wearing shorts under the skirt.

Jewelry

Boys: All jewelry must be tasteful and worn in a non-distracting manner. Boys are permitted to wear one watch, one finger ring and one necklace. Only simple, fine-gauged, 16 to 20-inch, silver or gold chain necklaces are permitted. Necklaces must be worn inside the shirt. One charity/motivational bracelet may be worn to support an appropriate cause provided it does not make inappropriate allusions.

Girls: All jewelry must be tasteful and worn in a non-distracting manner; gaudy costume or novelty jewelry is not uniform attire. Girls have the option of wearing one pair of matching earrings (No other body piercings are permitted), one watch, one finger ring and one necklace. Earrings must be worn on the ear lobe and cannot hang more than one-half inch below the ear lobe. Only fine-gauged, 16 to 20 inch, silver or gold chain necklaces are permitted. Necklace pendants, if worn, must be less than an inch in length, width, or diameter. Girls may wear one tasteful, non-distracting bracelet. One additional charity/ motivational bracelet may be worn to support an appropriate cause provided it does not make inappropriate allusions.

Hair

Boys: Hair should be neatly combed or styled. Hair must be above the top of the shirt collar. Hair should be styled so that it does not fall below the eyebrows or past the midpoint of the ear. Hair must be natural looking and conservative in its color and cut (no unnatural streaking/highlighting, no artificial jetblack coloring, and no unnatural colors). Hair may not change color during the school year. All boys must be clean-shaven. Sideburns must be neatly trimmed and may not grow below the bottom of the ear. Accommodations for religious reasons are permitted.

Girls: Hair should be neatly combed or styled. Neat small bows, barrettes, headbands, and hair ties are permissible so long as they coordinate with the uniform. Hair must be natural looking and conservative in its color and cut (no unnatural streaking/chunky highlights, no artificial jet-black coloring, and no unnatural colors). Hair may not change color during the school year. Accommodations for religious reasons are permitted.



- 4. Reason for absence (please be specific)

Please provide an email to the attendance line before 9:00 am. Without an email, we will send a robo call and ask that you respond quickly so we may clear the absence. Note: All absences will be marked unexcused should we not hear from you.

Absences

When a student is absent and in need of make-up work, they should first check the Weekly Homework Chart for assignments. Should they have questions or need additional assignments, they are to email their teacher(s) directly. Please do not ask the attendance line to acquire assignments for your student. If items need to be picked up from campus, teachers will leave these items in the front office.

Tardies

We ask that any appointments (e.g., medical, dental, etc.) reported as a tardy to bring the documentation/slip from that office for auditing purposes. At time of check in, our Raptor system, allows to select reason for tardy "Doctor/Dentist or appointments." Please note that if a student is tardy more than 3 times, a detention will be issued. In addition, parents **must** sign students late to 1st period into school when tardy. (this excludes students who drive themselves).
