City of Phoenix Construction

Beginning Monday, October 23, the City of Phoenix will begin a pavement preservation project along 32nd Street, between Greenway

Road and Thunderbird Road. The city's contractor, Weems Asphalt, will be applying a crack seal treatment as a maintenance measure to prevent infiltration of water into the pavement and to extend the life of the road. Major changes and improvements are coming to the 2024–2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form. As a result, the new form will be available in December 2023, not October 1. To prepare, we encourage all seniors and parents to create their own <u>FSA ID account</u> today. Select out-of-state colleges may additionally require a <u>CSS Profile</u> to award financial aid.

Sophomores – Juniors

Tuesday, October 24 – A great primer for standardized testing, the **digital PSAT** can qualify juniors for the National Merit Scholarship Program and other honors. Encourage your student to be well rested and eat a filling breakfast. See below for a list of optional items to bring:

Field Day - Dress Code

Field day is coming this Friday! All high school students are placed on teams with themes. Please have your student look at the rosters posted in the courtyard to see which team they are on. They are allowed to dress in these themes for field day, but they must follow the guidelines from the handbook below. Middle school students will compete in their gladiator teams. We are expecting their shirts to be in on time for them to wear them on Field Day,

but if not, they should try to dress in their team color! Below you will find the Athletic dress code for Field Day.

Just as the Academy provides guidelines for dress code in the classroom, it is important to project the image of professionalism in our athletic attire as well. All shirts worn for athletic practices and field day should be modest, loose fitting, in good repair (no holes, torn sleeves, etc.), should be worn either tucked in or well over the waist of the pants/shorts if not tucked in. No midriffs may be shown. T-shirts are preferred—no tank tops, camisoles, or sports bras may be worn as outer-garments. Sleeveless shirts may be worn if modest. Pants/shorts should be modest and in good repair (no holes, torn sleeves, etc.) Pants should be worn at the waist and should be no shorter than mid-thigh, and no-longer than just below the knee. No short-shorts or long baggy shorts may be worn. No boxers or undergarments may be visible. Attire should be free of inappropriate messages. Sports team logos (e.g., Diamondbacks, Notre Dame), and apparel brand names (e.g., Adidas, Nike) are acceptable, provided they do not make inappropriate allusions. These guidelines also apply to sweatshirts and jackets that students may wear. Footwear should be athletic in nature: no sandals, open-toed, or platform shoes. Hats and sunscreen may be appropriate if the students will be in the sun. Hat styles should follow the same guidelines as above.

FAQ:

Can I wear leggings? Yes, but only athletic ones and please make sure your shirt covers the waist.

Can I wear a pop-culture shirt? No, but you can wear sports teams.

Can I just wear my uniform? Of course!

Can I wear crazy socks? Please do! Support your team as much as possible.

Can I wear clothes supporting politicians or political views? Please don't.

Tardies
