The Student Brag Sheet is available as a survey in Naviance, our college planning portal.

The <u>Achievement Tutoring Program</u> offers up to 24 hours of FREE ACT Test Prep for Arizona students. Computer-based, private tutoring sessions are held for up to 60 minutes, for a maximum of four days per week, for a total of six weeks. To sign up for the upcoming 6-week block of free tutoring, parents must register their student by Monday, March 18.

Practice ACT Test – Wednesday, March 20 at 1:30 PM in Room 515. Juniors may sign up to take a full-length practice ACT test in preparation for on campus ACT testing Tuesday, April 9.

Grades, Evaluations, and Midquarter Progress Reports

Philosophy of Grading

Teachers at the Academy do not merely crunch numbers to determine grades. It is true that there can be tests, etc., where there are clear right and wrong answers that can be tallied in an unambiguous and indisputable fashion. Which grade to assign to such results is still, however, a judgment of the teacher and takes into consideration such things as the goals of the course, the way in which the material has been taught, the right expectations from this class, etc. Teachers also consider the student's sense of wonder, depth of inquiry, specific areas of mastery and needs for improvement, and attitudes toward learning and towards others.

FAQ

Q: Will the evaluation include everything that the MQPR includes?

A: Yes

Q: If a student asks me what their grade is, how should I respond?

A: We believe that learning and habits are more important than grades, however, students and parents are entitled to know where they stand. If a student is hyper-focused on grades we want to have a conversation and help them understand our philosophy. If a student wants to see all of their grades, they should be directed to Ms. Jensen. A teacher should never show a student their grade in another teacher's class.

Q: What about Advanced Notices?

A: The MQPR takes the place of Advanced Notices. This means you no longer have to write them each quarter, however you may still include comments at your discretion to contextualize a student's grade.

Q: How does the QI and Q3 comment bank work?

A: There will be "district comments" in powerschool that you may select for each student. Categories will include behavior, participation, study habits, etc. Essentially, those things that we would typically comment on in an evaluation. These comments, paired with the category totals, will give parents an accurate view of how their student is doing before conferences.

Tardies

We ask that any appointments (e.g., medical, dental, etc.) reported as a tardy to bring the documentation/ slip from that office for auditing purposes. At time of check in, our Raptor system, allows to select reason for tardy "Doctor/Dentist or appointments." Please note that if a student is tardy more than 3 times, a detention will be issued. **In addition, parents must sign students late to 1st period into school when tardy.** (*this excludes students who drive themselves*).
