Practice ACT Test – Wednesday, April 3 at 1:30 PM in Room 515. Juniors may sign up to take a full-length practice ACT test in preparation for on campus ACT testing Tuesday, April 9. Access the **Preparing for the ACT Test Guide** for a full-length practice test, information about the multiple-choice and writing sections, and test-taking strategies.

Paper-based ACT Testing – Tuesday, April 9 in the Gym. We recommend that juniors visit **myact.org** to create an account. They'll receive an email notification from ACT once scores are available. *It's important that students arrive to campus on time.* Those who are tardy will not be allowed to enter the testing room. Please encourage students to be well rested, eat a filling breakfast and bring the following:

- Sharpened No. 2 pencils with good erasers; no mechanical pencils or ink pens
- Snacks and drinks for test breaks
- Approved calculator
- Sweatshirt

Tardies

We ask that any appointments (e.g., medical, dental, etc.) reported as a tardy to bring the documentation/slip from that office for auditing purposes.
