Junior Class Field Trip to Northern Arizona University

Thursday, November 7 from 7 AM – 4:30 PM

Juniors will participate in a group visit to Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff! The visit will include a campus tour, presentations about admissions and financial aid, and an opportunity to see what it's like on a college campus. Lunch will be provided. To confirm their seat, please sign the permission slip and pay the \$15/student participation fee in our Payment Portal by Monday, Friday, November 1. Contact College Counseling with your questions.

Seniors

Once Seniors receive their acceptance letter, we encourage them to search for **Institutional Scholarships**. All three in-state universities now use *Scholarship Universe*, a portal which connects them to internal and external scholarships based on a personalized profile. **Arizona State University** and the **University of Arizona** portals are now live for fall 2025! Expect to see opportunities post to **Northern Arizona University**'s portal in January 2025.

Private scholarships are financial aid awards funded by companies, service groups, foundations, and more. Some of our favorite search engines include: **Arizona Community Foundation**, **College Depot**, and **Scholarships.com**. Pro-tip: create a separate email address for the scholarship search and use a **Scholarship Tracker** (save a copy) to stay on top of deadlines and requirements.

Here's an example of a current private scholarship opportunity:

Tuesday, November 12 – Deadline for <u>Elks' Most Valuable Student</u> scholarship awards ranging from \$1,000 – 7,500. Applicants do **not** need to be related to a member of the Elks.

Iuniors

During Calculus classes this week, our College 101 workshops focused on **post-high school pathways**. Next month, we delve into college fit in preparation for building college lists in December. As homework, juniors have been asked to complete the Intelligences assessment in Naviance under the Self-discovery tab.

Sophomores – Juniors

The PSAT/NMSQT is digital! The test is easier to take, shorter, has more time per question, and comes with a built-in calculator. It can also qualify Juniors for the National Merit Scholarship Program and other recognition opportunities with College Board. To prepare, full-length adaptive digital PSAT/NMSQT free practice exams are available on the Bluebook app. Mark the date **Tuesday, October 29th** when NPX will proctor the test for sophomores and juniors on campus.

Wednesday, October 16th from 1:30 – 4 PM in the MPR. Sophomores and Juniors are invited to take a **FREE practice PSAT/NMSQT exam** on campus. Think of practice exams as a diagnostic tool to help your student focus their study time and gain familiarity with the test's digital format. Optional items to bring: calculator, sharpened pencils and a snack.

All High School Graded

Encourage your students to get involved in a couple of clubs, sports or other extracurricular activities either at school or in the local community. Keep track of their engagement on this **simple spreadsheet** (save a copy).

STUDENT GROWTH PLANS

This year NPX has made some changes to our Student Growth Plans (SGPs). These plans have been scaffolded and modified to reflect the needs of middle and high school students. Students will complete SGPs prior to Fall Break during class or lyceum. The SGPs will be reviewed and referred to during your student's conference. If you are receiving a conference invitation in October, the SGP for middle or high school will be linked to the invitation.





Q1 EVALUATIONS

Your child's evaluations will include a summary of what they learned and comments that are generated from a district comment bank.

While these comments are selected from a list of possible comments, please know that the teachers select comments that are representative of your student's accomplishments and/or needs.

Some teachers may choose to include anecdotes as well. Narrative evaluations will be written for your child at the end of the semester.

FALL CONFERENCES

Fall conferences will be held on October 14th and 15th via Teams (virtual). In-person conferences will be available the afternoon of October 16th and are by invitation only. Fall conferences are filled on a first-come basis. A waitlist will be established for families who do not solidify a spot and who need a conference. In-person conferences will be offered by a separate email invitation, which will be sent on Friday, September 27th.





JANUARY CONFERENCES

The administration team is committed to providing all students with a conference experience this year. If you do not receive an invitation for an October conference, you will receive an invitation for a January conference. 

Reporting Absences

To report your scholar(s) absence, please provide an **email to Attendance@NorthPhoenixPrep.org** with the following information:

- 1. Student(s) First and Last Name
- 2. Grade
- 3. Date of Absence(s)
- 4. Reason for absence (please be specific)

Please provide an email to attendance@northphoenixprep.org **before 8:00am**. A notification reminder will be sent mid-morning to those who have not indicated, via email, that the student is missing school. Absences will be marked unexcused if an email is not received or if the reason for absence is anything other than illness, doctor appointment, bereavement, family emergency or suspension.

Tardies

Students arriving late to campus must check in through the front office. For auditing purposes, all tardies due to an appointment (e.g., medical, dental, etc.) will be marked unexcused until a note is received; and we ask that parents sign in their scholar at the front desk. If a student is tardy more than 3 times, a detention will be issued.

Absences

When a student is absent and in need of make-up work, they should first check the Weekly Homework Chart for assignments. Should they have questions or need additional assignments, they are to email their teachers directly.

Gladiator Gear

Show your school spirit on Fridays! Visit the <u>Gladiator Spirit Store</u> to purchase clothing that may be worn on Fridays. Throughout the year, our Senate will be selling uniform approved sweatshirts that may be worn any day.

Outerwear


