#### **Credit Courses**

The following courses meet the NPX standard for high school credit or middle school promotion, but may also be taken for remediation and reinforcing skills and concepts. These courses can help transferring students align with the NPX curriculum, and returning students to complete missed credit. <u>These courses are not intended to substitute for future curricular coursework.</u>

Course	Description	Schedule	Fee
PRE/ INTERMEDIATE ALGEBRA (MS)	What it covers: Computational and number sense skills of calculation necessary for the completion of Pre-Algebra and Intermediate Algebra. This course will be differentiated to suit the needs of each student and will use Khan Academy to help reinforce the skills.  Who it's for: 6 <sup>th</sup> and 7 <sup>th</sup> graders who did not pass Pre-algebra or incoming 8 <sup>th</sup> graders who did not passPre/ Intermediate Algebra  Instructor: Mr. Fierro	June 2 – 26 (Mon-Thur) 10:00-12:00 am	\$375
LITERATURE/ COMPOSITION (MS)	What it covers: Advanced middle school skills of reading, writing, and speaking, with a focus on the writing curriculum at NPX  Who it's for: 8 <sup>th</sup> graders who did not pass 7 <sup>th</sup> grade Lit/comp or new to NPX 7 <sup>th</sup> or 8 <sup>th</sup> graders  Instructor: Ms. Patton	June 2 – 26 (Mon-Thur) 8:00 – 10:00 am	\$375

ALGEBRA I (HS)	What it covers: Methods of algebraic thinking that align with the process and practice of the Exeter Curriculum. This course satisfies the AZ state credit requirement for Algebra I.  Who it's for: Incoming 9 <sup>th</sup> and 10 <sup>th</sup> graders who do not have an Algebra credit, or incoming 9 <sup>th</sup> graders who did not pass Algebra I  *this course satisfies NPX and AZ graduation requirements  Instructor: Mr. Poulson	June 2 – 26 (Mon-Thur) 8:00 – 10:00 am	\$425
GEOMETRY (HS)	What it covers: A study of geometry's elements  Who it's for: Incoming 10 <sup>th</sup> -12 <sup>th</sup> HS students who do not have a Geometry credit, or returning HS students who did not pass one or both semesters of Geometry  *this course satisfies NPX and AZ graduation requirements  Instructor: Mr. Fierro	June 2 – 26 (Mon-Thur) 8:00 – 10:00 am	\$425
HUMANE LETTERS I-III (Hybrid and levels TBD)	What is covers: This course will cover the literature and writing selections for Humane Letters III. This course will cover the 1 <sup>st</sup> semester of Humane Letters III.  Who it's for: 9 <sup>th</sup> -11 <sup>th</sup> HS  Instructor: HL I-III-Mr. Sokolis/Ms. Flood	June 2 – 26 (Mon-Thur) 8:00-11:00 am	\$425 (per 1 credit)
ECONOMICS (HS)	What it covers: This course will explore the major developments thought from Adam Smith to F.A. Hayek through readings, discussions/lectures and writing assignments. Students will cover the emergence of Classical Economics and the division of labor, supply and demand and the development of the Austrian School of Economics.  Who it's for: 10 <sup>th</sup> 12 <sup>th</sup> grade students and/or returning students who failed economics.  *this course satisfies NPX and AZ graduation requirements  Instructor: Mr. Poulson	June 2 – 26 (Mon-Thur) (This course will be conducted online)	\$375
POETRY (HS)	What it covers: The purpose of the poetry curriculum at Great Hearts is three-fold: first, introduce students to a range of classic writings primarily by British and American poets such as John Donne, Samuel Taylor Coleridge, Emily Dickinson, and Robert Frost. Second, develop in students an appreciation for these works- and those of their peers	June 2 – 26 (Mon-Thur)	\$375

	and themselves. And third, provide students with a working set of tools and techniques that, through their own writing, they will learn how to transmit image, emotions, and ideas to a reader of their work. In our summer curriculum, students will cover a broad range of subjects regarding verse, from, shaping, and genre. Additionally, students will memorize and perform a Shakespearean dramatic monologue. The course will conclude with a final examination of all topics covered during the summer program.  Who it's for: Incoming 10 <sup>th</sup> -12 <sup>th</sup> HS students and/or students who failed poetry or would like to take this class as enrichment. CALCULUS I/II (1 <sup>st</sup> semester)	What it covers: 1 <sup>ST</sup> Semester Calculus I content  Who it's for: rising 12 <sup>th</sup> Graders who failed Calculus I.  *this course satisfies NPX and AZ graduation requirements  Instructor: Mr. Poulson	June 2 – 26 (Mon-Thur) 10:15-12:45	\$425

#### Summer Academy Policies and Procedures

Homework: Homework may be assigned to strengthen student understanding from each class meeting. In order to cover the essential concepts of a semester-long course, instructors will clearly communicate student expectations in this area.

Dress Code: Students must wear their school uniforms to summer school, including testing sessions for Independent Study students. All other policies regarding personal appearance are governed by the North Phoenix Preparatory Academy Family Handbook. Uniforms are encouraged for online classes. Students taking the Prep for Prep courses may wear their uniform from ANP or khaki shorts and a black polo.

Behavior: Students are expected to behave in a manner consistent with the behavioral expectations of North Phoenix Prep as outlined in the NPX Family Handbook. Students removed from a class or activity for disciplinary reasons will jeopardize their continued enrollment in the program as well as their registration fee(s).
