

Tuesday, **October 21st.** A great primer for standardized testing, the digital PSAT can qualify juniors for the National Merit Scholarship Program and other honors. Encourage your student to be well rested, eat a filling breakfast, and bring a snack. Juniors are scheduled to test in the morning; sophomores will test after lunch.

CAREER EXPLORATION

Before break, Juniors utilized Naviance's Self Discovery assessments to explore career options. If your child is unsure about their future career or major, there are great tools to help them find direction. My Next Move, sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor, offers a free O*NET Career Interest Profiler to help users explore how their interests align with different careers. ASU's me3 is an interactive quiz designed to match student interests with possible majors and career paths. The University of Arizona's "What Can I Do with This Major?" resource connects academic majors with real-world career options, helping students see the possibilities ahead.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS

Early bind discount.



Students do not need to be enrolled in an AP class to take the AP exam. Great Hearts classes, however, do not align with AP curriculum. It is recommended students invest **significant time to prepare** for the exam. In order to receive credit, students typically need to score at least a 3, 4 or 5.

AP exam cost: \$100 by November 2 or \$140 by March 1 | Exam length: 120 - 180 minutes

Before taking AP exams, research each college's AP policy and course equivalency guide. Access registration instructions and FAQs.



2026-2027 FAFSA NOW OPEN

Senior families, the <u>Free Application</u> <u>for Federal Student Aid</u> (FAFSA) form is now available!

Families must complete the FAFSA form to be eligible for federal student aid such as federal grants, work-study funds, and loans. *Priority deadline: January 15*

FINDING SCHOLARSHIPS FOR COLLEGE

Once Seniors receive their acceptance letter, we encourage them to search for INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS. All three in-state universities utilize Scholarship Universe, a portal which connects them to internal and external scholarships based on a personalized profile. **Arizona State University** and the **University of Arizona** portals are live for fall 2026! Expect to see opportunities post to **Northern Arizona University**'s portal in January 2026.

Here's an example: ASU's Next Generation Service Corps application is now open! The Corps develops character-driven leaders who are committed to becoming catalysts for social change and offers a scholarship that ensures students have base tuition coverage. Two NPX Seniors were selected last year! Priority deadline: January 15

PRIVATE SCHOLARSHIPS are financial aid awards

funded by companies, service groups, foundations, and more. Some of our favorite search engines include: **College Depot**, **Scholarships.com**, and **GoingMerry**. Pro-tip: create a separate email address for the scholarship search and use a **Scholarship Tracker** (save a copy) to stay on top of deadlines and requirements.

Here's an example: **Elks' Most Valuable Student** scholarship offers awards ranging from \$1,000 – 7,500. Applicants do not need to be related to a member of the Elks.

FIELD DAY DRESS CODE REMINDER

Field Day is next Friday! Students will be outdoors and active.

To ensure everyone is dressed appropriately for safety and modesty, please read these guidelines. Field Day & Athletic Practice Dress Code: Our athletic attire guidelines ensure professionalism and modesty, just like the classroom dress code.

- **High School Students:** Check the rosters posted in the courtyard to see your team and theme. You are encouraged to dress in your team theme, but you must follow the dress code below.
- Middle School Students: You will be competing with your Gladiator teams.
 - We expect your team shirts to arrive on time.
 - If the shirts are delayed, please dress in your team color!

Shirts and Tops

- Preferred: T-shirts.
- Must be: Modest, loose-fitting, and in good repair (no holes or tears).
- Length: Worn well over the waist of the pants/shorts if untucked. No midriffs may be shown.
- Outerwear: No tank tops, camisoles, or sports bras worn as outer garments. Sleeveless shirts are permitted only if they are modest.
- Jackets/Sweatshirts: Must also follow all shirt guidelines.

Pants and Shorts

- Must be: Modest and in good repair (no holes).
- Fit: Worn at the waist.
- Length: No shorter than mid-thigh and no longer than just below the knee.
- Not allowed: Short-shorts or long, baggy shorts.
- Undergarments: Boxers or other undergarments may not be visible.

General Guidelines

- Footwear: Must be athletic in nature (e.g., sneakers/tennis shoes). No sandals, open-toed, or platform shoes.
- Logos/Messaging: Attire must be free of inappropriate messages. Sports team logos (e.g., Diamondbacks) and apparel brand names (e.g., Nike) are acceptable, provided they do not make inappropriate allusions.
- Hats & Sun Protection: Hats and sunscreen are appropriate for sun exposure. Hat styles must follow the same general guidelines (i.e., appropriate messaging).
